FOREST STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM

Our beautiful foothills forests may not be as idyllic as they appear. Years of fire suppression have left many areas with forests that are too thick. The dense stands of pine and fir can be unhealthy, as overcrowding leaves the trees weak from competition for sun and soil. These weak trees are more susceptible to disease and insect infestations. The overly dense forests are also a fire hazard, offering more fuel for hotter, faster fires.

Is your forested property in need of some help? You can get a free professional assessment of your forest, and financial assistance for work to make your forest healthier from the Washington State Department of Natural Resources (DNR).

The DNR Forest Stewardship Program offers "advice and assistance to help family forest owners manage their lands." A wealth of information about the program is available on the DNR website, easiest found by searching in Google for "DNR forest stewardship." (The DNR website is not the easiest to navigate). The assistance offered includes free forest management advice and grants for up to 50% of the cost of brush control, thinning, pruning, and slash disposal. This advice and money is available even if you have only a few acres.

For more information, see the DNR website or contact your regional DNR office at (509) 684-7474. This year is shaping up to be a dry, dangerous fire season; contact the DNR now for help in keeping your forest healthy.

FARM TOY COLLECTION

Around the Foothills we see a lot of farm equipment rolling out in the fields, planting, harvesting, and tending to the crops. Some of the equipment is large, some small, some old, some new. But the largest collection of farm equipment in the Foothills is also the smallest – and it never rolls out in the fields. That is because this equipment is in Jim Wallrabenstein's house. Resting on shelves. Jim holds one of the larger farm toy collections in the western U.S., with more than 465 scale models and toys filling 230 linear feet of shelf space in his home.



Jim's interest in farm machinery is in his blood. He grew up on a family farm in Ohio, and his great-grandfather, grandfather, and father were all

farmers. Jim is not himself a farmer but he appreciates the Foothills' agricultural heritage, and he has enjoyed working seasonally for over 20 years trucking grain and grass seed for Kaelin Farms at harvest time. Jim's favorite toys as a child were farm toys, and as he got older, his playing transformed into collecting. He has been collecting for over 45 years.

The first six 1/16 scale die-cast metal toy tractors that began his collection were a John Deere 3020 ('64), Allis-Chalmers 190 ('65), Oliver 1850 ('66), Case 1030 ('67), Minneapolis-Moline G1000 ('68) and International 1256 with cab ('68).

Although Jim is reluctant to name a favorite model, he says that his "most cherished farm toys are replicas of Allis-Chalmers farm equipment" because his father farmed with Allis-Chalmers tractors,

Jim has a room in his



home devoted to his display, which is arranged to tell the story of the development of mechanized farming from the earliest farm tractors produced in the first decades of the 20th century to the most modern, high-powered, GPS equipped tractors of today.

Farm toy collecting is now a world-wide hobby with thousands of collectors. In the United States, there is a National Farm Toy Museum in Dyersville, Iowa. Board meetings are held at the Community Center building on the second Monday of the month. Meetings begin at 7 p.m. and usually end just after 8 p.m. All Foothills residents are welcome and encouraged to attend.

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

FRA Alerts system has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. Residents are encouraged to report ALL crimes to Crime Check, 456-2233. The Foothills Community Center, 11000 N. 
