HELGAR-KRONQUIST LANDFILL

On February 17th the Department of Ecology hosted a public meeting to review and discuss a draft Agreed Order requiring Kaiser Aluminum to conduct a Remedial Investigation and Feasibility Study at the Heglar-Kronquist landfill. The purpose of the Remedial Investigation is to gather more information to determine the nature and extent of site-related contamination that may be in soil and groundwater. The Feasibility Study will evaluate cleanup options. Public comments were accepted from February 9 through March 11th. The public will be notified of additional comment periods as new documents are developed.

The Heglar-Kronquist site, nearly four acres, was used as a gravel pit until 1969. Subsequently the site was used as a disposal site which Kaiser used from 1969 to 1974 for disposal of aluminum black dross, a by-product from processing aluminum materials. The dross disposal was stopped in 1974 because of water and air sampling showed elevated levels of several organic compounds. Kaiser took several steps to address the contamination in 1984 including the installation of a cover over the dross pile. This cover consists of a two foot thick clay dressing topped with soil and grass, drainage ditches, and a passive gas venting system. Kaiser eventually purchased the property. Monitoring information from the early 1980s through 2004 indicated decreasing but still elevated chloride and nitrates in springs down gradient from the site. Kaiser agreed to sample wells before their legal agreement with Ecology was final because of the community concerns. Once the Agreed Order is finalized, Kaiser will conduct additional studies and identify potential cleanup options for the site.

ANTOINE PEAK ACQUISITION

Unfortunately, there is no news to report regarding Antoine Peak. The acquisition will be funded through three purchase phases; the first phase was completed in 2007 and protected 385 acres at the summit of the peak. Phase 2 consists of 370 acres, and is currently at the top of the acquisition list. Phase 3 consists of 336 acres and is fourth on the list. The rankings are based on a list of fifteen recommended acquisitions across the state of Washington rated in terms of ecological value, species protected, public benefit and use, educational and scientific values, and proximity to urban areas. Antoine Peak is especially unique considering that it is located just one mile from the Urban Growth Boundary. The completion of the acquisition process is dependent upon conservation futures funding and matching funding through grant programs. The level of funding in the capital budget for the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Program is currently set at \$100 million; however, with budget cuts happening across the state, this level of funding is in jeopardy. Cuts to this program could postpone the acquisition of the remainder of Antoine Peak. Please consider visiting the Washington Wildlife and Recreation Coalition website to comment on maintaining the current level of funding for worthy projects like Antoine Peak.



GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING - JANUARY 21, 2009

David Mundt, from the Spokane Noxious Weed board opened the meeting with a presentation on local noxious weeds and held a question and answer period.

A business meeting followed Mr. Mundt's presentation. The annual election was held and re-elected to office are the former board members Rich Krenkel, Holly Weiler, Ali Knecht and Don Tucker. One of the committee members who was rotating out was replaced by Cheryl Britton and Ashley Potter agreed to serve another three years. The meeting ended with a general discussion of the years past events and suggestions of how to increase membership and Foothills residents' participation in 2009.

2008 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

Memberships were below budget by \$320 (119 members from an expected 150 members). The numbers were down \$800 or 40 members, (almost 23%) from 2007. Rents from the Community Center were excellent this year, up \$500 (almost double) from 2007. Rental of the cottage remains, since 2003, FRA's largest source of funds. Gifts totaling \$585, were up almost \$100 from 2007 – way to go community! Other than the addition of purchasing a piano for the center, operating expenditures were held inline nicely and were actually down over \$1,700 from 2007. Even with the \$2,937.63 expenditure on the piano, we were only \$319.42 over the Original Budget, which did not include that line item. Our other two largest expenditures were for the newsletter and scholarships, followed by insurance and utilities. We gave out \$2,000 in scholarships, one for \$250 was returned as unused.

The Foothills Rural Association, 11000 N. Forker Road, was established as a non-profit corporation under section 502(C) (4) of the Internal Revenue Code on December 12, 1983. The purposes of the corporation are to organize the property owners and/or current residents within the boundaries of Fire District 9, Station 6: to provide a forum by which the property owners and/or current residents to assist governmental agencies in better planning the use and resources of the Foothills area: to preserve and protect the rural agricultural environment.

Voting Membership in the Association is open to any property owner or current resident within the Foothills boundaries. Membership dues are \$20 per year. Non-voting Membership is available to others through payment of dues. The Association is governed by elected volunteer officers and a board of directors.

A Community Crime Log has been established in an effort to increase community awareness about crime occurring in our area. The crime log will be published in the newsletter. The Foothills Community Center, 11000 N. Forker Road, which is located adjacent to the Foothills Fire Station, exists as a result of community efforts to save and renovate the former Foothills School Building. The Center, used for many community activities, is maintained and supported by the Foothills Rural Association. It is available for use by members of the Foothills Rural Association for a nominal utilities charge and by non-members for a reasonable rental fee. 


